

TRILLIUM PHASE 1 : GRANT DELIVERABLES

ACTIVITIES

Groundwork

- Establish a Collective Impact Steering Committee to lead the process
- Research national/provincial/municipal strategies and position papers of relevant stakeholder groups on climate change and visions for transition
- Interview system stakeholders to better understand the system in Ottawa and surrounding area and who is important to include in the fellowship

Invite the Fellows

- Identify influencers in our key sector groups and invite a select group to form the collective impact fellowship
- Host the initial two meetings of the fellowship

Define the IMPACT

- Clarify and explore together, the nature of the problem and its finer systemic issues of power, influence, capital, pace of change, resistance to change and explore realistic possibilities
- Develop first draft of theory of change
- Discuss meaningful shared measurement

DELIVERABLES

Groundwork

- State of the City summary report of research
- Systems of Influence stakeholder map
- Steering committee structured

This will help us select the right fellows and have everyone up to speed on the latest developments in our region.

Invitation

- 50-60 fellows invited, 30- 40 confirmed at least one from each key sector.
- Built trust among members through friendship and aiming high as a collective

This will build a high capacity team to tackle this most significant issue in a Collective Impact framework

Define the IMPACT

- Convening the fellowship to define the IMPACT
- Problem statement for Ottawa on Sustainable Energy System
- Theory of change document for Ottawa

This will kickstart the work and fundamental agreements to build on.

Partnership Development

To date, we have already made significant headway in building partnerships toward this collective impact strategy. These initial groups include: Community Energy Network, Ottawa Renewable Energy Cooperative, City of Ottawa partners, including Environmental Committee and Climate Action Plan committees, Peace & Environment Resource Centre, Carleton University, Ottawa University, Algonquin College, EnviroCentre, Ottawa City Eco-District, Hydro Ottawa, Enbridge, Bioregional, Chamber of Commerce and various political leaders. The next step will be to formalize these organizations within the fellowship and broaden the sectors and partners involved.
